

# Primary Election Sample Ballot

## Thurston County, Washington • September 14, 2004

This sample ballot contains all of the major political party candidates and all nonpartisan races and issues you are eligible to vote on. Nonpartisan means, as the context implies, Judicial offices, other offices without a party label, or ballot issues. You will be given four ballots. You must CHOOSE, VOTE and RETURN only ONE BALLOT. You are entitled to vote on all of the nonpartisan races and issues on this sample ballot, regardless of the party affiliation you may choose. Though party affiliation is inferred by choosing a political party ballot, no record will be made of the ballot you choose.

You may choose a political party ballot and vote for only that political party's candidates and the nonpartisan races; or, you may vote for the nonpartisan races only by choosing the nonpartisan ballot. If you have voted for nonpartisan candidates on one of the partisan ballots, you should return the partisan ballot and should not return the separate nonpartisan ballot.

The color of the political party shown on your ballot card must match the color on the top of each page of the political party candidates in your guide. You may also vote for the nonpartisan races that are not color coded. If you vote for a candidate other than the political party ballot you have chosen your vote WILL NOT COUNT. In all cases your votes for the nonpartisan races or issues will count.

To cast a write-in vote, write the candidate's complete name and party affiliation and the office you wish to cast your vote for on the write-in portion of the ballot. Be sure to include the district and/or position number for which you are casting your vote.

## City of Olympia Proposition No. 1 Parks and Recreation Facilities

The Olympia City Council adopted Ordinance No. 6314 to increase the tax on telephone, electrical, and natural gas business, for the purpose of helping fund wildlife habitat, natural areas, open space, parks, and trails and recreation-related sidewalks. This ballot measure would allow the City of Olympia to protect and preserve wildlife habitat, natural areas, and open space; acquire, develop and maintain waterfront, neighborhood, community and special use parks and playgrounds; and construct and improve hiking, biking, and walking trails and recreation-related sidewalks by increasing the tax on telephone, electrical, and natural gas business by three percent, all subject to review and recommendation by City Council-appointed citizen advisory committees.
