I have a more traditional, conservative view on these issues. I am also a big advocate of the highest possible achievements in academic and athletic fields.

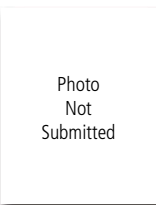

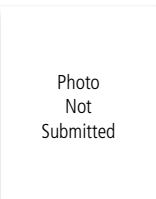
