

**Town of Bucoda - Town Council, Position No. 3**



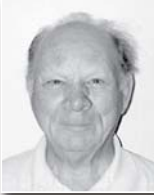
My name is Javier Lopez and I think that the time has come to bring to Bucoda honest, dedicated, non-bias, talented people. That is why I am running for town council.

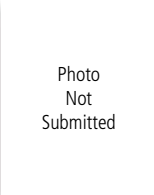
