As a resident, a home owner, a mother and a taxpayer, I am invested in seeing the city of Rainier continue to grow in a positive and

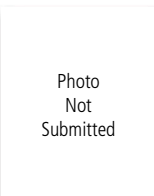

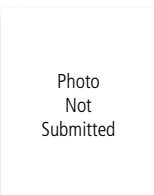
