City Of Olympia

Proposition No. 1
Fire Department Acquisition and Improvement Bonds - \$16,500,000

The City Council of the City of Olympia passed Ordinance No. 6554 concerning this proposition. This proposition authorizes the City to construct and equip a new fire station and a fire training center and acquire two fire engines and a ladder truck, issue general obligation bonds in the principal amount of \$16,500,000, maturing within a maximum of twenty years from date of issue, and levy property taxes annually in addition to regular tax levies to repay such bonds, all as provided in Ordinance No. 6554.

Fire Protection District No. 1 (Grand Mound - Rochester)

Proposition No. 1 Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 1, Thurston County, Washington, (Grand Mound - Rochester Fire) adopted Resolution No. 2008-01 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2009 for maintenance, and operations costs. The levy amount will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.

Fire Protection District No. 3 (Lacey)

Proposition No. 1 Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 3, Thurston County, Washington, (Lacey Fire District 3) adopted Resolution No. 788-05-08 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2009 to pay increases in operational costs, and set the limit factor at 100% plus the annual percentage change in the Consumer Price Index (as identified in the Resolution) for each of the five succeeding years (2010 - 2014). The 2014 levy amount will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.

The proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy to an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2009 for maintenance, operations, equipment and personnel costs. The levy amount will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.
