City of Lacey - City Council, Position No. 6



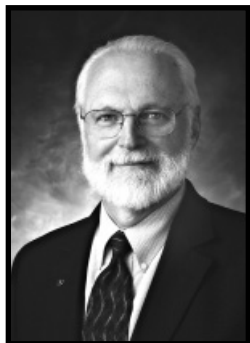
