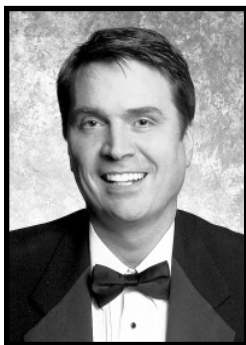
neighborhoods.
