I look forward to continuing the charge forward. In

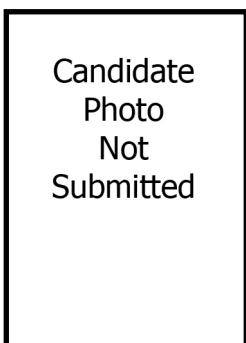
