Vaccine Administration During a Public Health Response - Required (NEW)

This training covers the role of the vaccinator during a public health response in a public or private clinic. The focus will be specifically on reviewing techniques required for intramuscular injections, subcutaneous injections, nasal spray administration, and vaccination techniques for small children. This training is for those volunteers who are licensed to administer vaccinations. This training is **required for** all licensed members who choose to volunteer at public or private vaccination clinics in the future.

Orientation to Medical Reserve Corps – Required

Orientation meetings are approximately two hours in length and cover members' roles and responsibilities in emergency response, the Incident Command System, activation and deployment procedures, and other training opportunities. Orientation is required to be an active volunteer. Members will complete necessary paperwork to register as a Washington State Emergency Worker. Member will be issued an emergency worker number and card after attending the orientation. Volunteers must have an emergency worker number to be eligible for any deployment with the Thurston County MRC unit. Priority is given to Thurston County MRC members but the public is welcome.
