

Notifiable Conditions & Washington's Health Care Facilities



The following conditions are notifiable to Thurston County Public Health and Social Services Department in accordance with WAC 246-101. When they occur or are treated in the health care facility. Contact the local health jurisdiction of the patient's residence, except for conditions followed by a reporting phone number. Timeframes for notification are footnoted. **Immediately notifiable conditions are indicated in bold** and found in the box below should be reported when suspected or confirmed. Hospital laboratories should use the *Notifiable Conditions & Washington's Laboratory* poster.

IMMEDIATELY NOTIFIABLE CONDITIONS

 Birth Defects^{Mo}: Abdominal wall defects, Autism spectrum disorders, Cerebral palsy, Down syndrome, Alcohol related birth defects, Hypospadias, Limb reductions, Neural tube defects, Oral clefts **360-236-3533**

^{Imm} Immediately – Requires a phone call to reach a live person at the local health jurisdiction, 24/7
^{24h} Within 24 hours – Requires a phone call if reporting after Public health business hours
^{3d} Within 3 business days
^{Mo} Monthly
