

Notifiable Conditions & the Health Care Provider



The following conditions are notifiable to Thurston County Public Health and Social Services Department in accordance with WAC 246-101. Contact the local health jurisdiction of the patient's residence, except for the conditions followed by a reporting phone number. Timeframes for notification are indicated in the footnotes. Immediately notifiable conditions are found in the box below.

- Asthma, occupational (suspected or confirmed)^{Mo} 1-888-66SHARP
- Birth Defects^{Mo}: Autism spectrum disorders, Cerebral palsy, Alcohol related birth defects 360-236-3533
- Brucellosis (*Brucella* species)^{24h}

CODE LEGEND

- Imm Immediately – Requires a phone call to reach a live person at the local health jurisdiction, 24/7
- 24h Within 24 hours – Requires a phone call if reporting after Public health business hours
- 3d Within 3 business days
- Mo Monthly
