Comments	The marker is part of the effort by the Daughters and Sons of the American Revolution to mark the Oregon Trail in 1916. George Washington Bush, a man of color, came in 1845 to this area south of Tumwater, named Bush Prairie in his honor, with the first group of Americans to found a settlement north of the Columbia River.
