SUBJECT: Fireworks Permitting Amendment Options

Request:

The Board of County Commissioners (Board) has requested staff to develop options for banning or further restricting consumer fireworks. Staff has prepared two options for the Board to consider, which are attached. The proposed options may be modified following the public hearing. Modifications may also be made to other sections governing fireworks permitting (Chapter 6.68 TCC) as deemed appropriate by the Board within the scope of the public hearing notification.

Option 1: Ban Consumer Fireworks

With this option, consumer fireworks as defined in 70.77.136 would be banned in unincorporated Thurston County. This ban would not prohibit public displays and other legally permissible use of fireworks such as wildlife management, religious and private organization displays, or those used for agricultural purposes as indicated in state law. Examples of consumer fireworks are located in the attached handouts from the Washington State Patrol "Washington State Legal Consumer Fireworks for Sale in Tents and Stands per RCW 70.77.163," illegal fireworks are shown in "Fireworks and Explosive Devices that are Illegal in Washington State."

Option 2: Emergency Ban for Extreme Fire Danger

With this option, all fireworks may be banned in times of extreme fire danger. The County manager would have final decision making authority after consulting with the county fire marshal and others with expertise such as area fire chiefs or the Department of Natural Resources.

Public Hearing Date and Time:

Any new regulations passed by the Board will not go into effect until one calendar year after adoption. It is legal to sell consumer fireworks in Thurston County beginning June 28th of each year.

In order to put option 1 into effect by June 28, 2017, the public hearing needs to be held and regulations adopted by Monday June 27th. The minimum notice for the public hearing is 10 days. On June 17, 2016, public notice was published in "The Olympian," a press release was issued, a web mail sent, and the information was posted on the Thurston County home page.

Background:

Thurston County is permitted to pass more restrictive regulations on fireworks. New regulations, including bans, are effective one year following adoption. Thurston County cannot ban fireworks for the July 4, 2016 season.

Currently, Thurston County follows state law for the sale of consumer fireworks, which allows fireworks to be sold from twelve o'clock noon to eleven o'clock p.m. on the twenty-eighth of June, from nine o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. on each day from the twenty-ninth of June through the fourth of July, from nine o'clock a.m. to nine o'clock p.m. on the fifth of July.

The discharge of consumer fireworks, as defined in RCW 70.77.136, is restricted to 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. on July 3rd and 9 a.m. to 11 p.m. on July 4th.

Thurston County has already restricted the sale, purchase, possession, and discharge of any consumer fireworks outside of the above dates.

Fireworks are regulated by federal, state and local laws. These include:

- Federal Law 27-555 - The Regulation of Explosives
- State Explosives Law - Washington Administrative Code (WAC) 296-52
- State Fireworks Law - RCW 70.77
- State Fireworks Rules - WAC 212-17
- Fireworks Permits - TCC Chapter 6.68
- Thurston County Park Code – TCC Chapter 10.76
- Thurston County Zoning Ordinances

Thurston County Fireworks Permits (TCC Chapter 6.68)

Thurston County currently regulates the discharge of fireworks with Chapter 6.68 Fireworks Permits.

This chapter requires a permit for the following:

- Manufacture, import, export, possession or sale of any fireworks at wholesale or retail for any use
- Discharge of fireworks at any place
- Public display of fireworks
- Transport of fireworks, except as a public carrier

Thurston County Park Code (TCC Chapter 10.76)

The Thurston County Parks Code restricts the possession or discharge of any fireworks in any county park, except at times and locations designated by the county. Violations of the Park Code are a misdemeanor and if convicted must pay a fine of \$250 (10.76.410).

Thurston County Zoning Ordinances (TCC Titles 20, 21, 22, and 23)

The Thurston County Zoning Ordinances only include regulations on the placement of temporary sales locations. They do not include any restrictions on the discharge of fireworks. Only minor amendments would be required to ban the sale of fireworks in unincorporated Thurston County.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THURSTON COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 6.68 TO PROHIBIT THE SALE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, OR USE OF CONSUMER FIREWORKS, AND FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 77.77.250(4) and .395, the Board of Thurston County Commissioners (Board) have the authority to enact an ordinance to prohibit the sale, purchase, possession, or use of consumer fireworks; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 70.77.250, Any ordinances adopted by a county that is more restrictive than the state fireworks law shall have an effective date no sooner than one year after their adoption; and

WHEREAS, RCW 70.77.395 limits the sale and purchase of consumer fireworks from twelve p.m. to eleven p.m. on the twenty-eighth of June, from nine a.m. to eleven p.m. on each day from the twenty-ninth of June through the fourth of July, from nine a.m. to nine p.m. on the fifth of July; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 11946 the Board previously restricted the discharge of consumer fireworks to nine o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. on July 3rd and nine o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. on July 4th; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 12815 the Board previously prohibited the sale, purchase, possession, or use of consumer fireworks on December 27, 2002 through 1:00 a.m. on January 2003 and thereafter on the same period each year; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it necessary for the protection of the health, safety and general welfare of the residents in Thurston County to prohibit the sale, purchase, possession, and use of fireworks all year in unincorporated Thurston County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THURSTON COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Thurston County Fireworks Permit regulations, Section 6.68.055 TCC is hereby amended to prohibit the sale, possession and use of consumer fireworks as shown in Attachment A to this ordinance.

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or other portion of this Ordinance or its application to any person is, for any reason, declared invalid, illegal or unconstitutional in whole or in part by any court or agency of competent jurisdiction, said decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect one year after adoption pursuant to RCW 70.77.250(4)

OPTION 1: BAN CONSUMER FIREWORKS

Chapter 6.68 - FIREWORKS PERMITS

Sections:

6.68.010 - Acts prohibited without permit.

No person, without securing a permit, shall do any of the following:

- A. Manufacture, import, export, possess or sell any fireworks at wholesale or retail for any use, including agricultural purposes or wildlife control;
- B. Discharge dangerous fireworks at any place;
- C. Make a public display of fireworks;
- D. Transport fireworks, except as a public carrier.

6.68.020 - Permit fees.

The fee for each permit required by this chapter and Chapter 70.77 RCW shall be ten dollars except in the case of permits for the retail sale of fireworks which shall require a permit fee of five dollars.

6.68.030 - Application for permit.

Any person desiring a permit pursuant to this chapter shall make written application for a permit to the Thurston County auditor's office. Applications shall be made at least ten days prior to the issuance of a permit.

6.68.040 - Investigation.

The auditor shall transmit each application to the building department which shall make an investigation and submit a report of its findings and recommendations for or against the issuance of the permit together with its reasons therefor to the board of county commissioners.

6.68.050 - Grant or deny permit.

The board of county commissioners shall have power in its discretion to grant or deny any application, subject to such reasonable conditions, if any, as it shall prescribe. The auditor's office shall issue any permit granted by the board of county commissioners.

6.68.055 - Consumer fireworks.

Pursuant RCW 70.77.395, Thurston County prohibits the sale, possession, and discharge of consumer fireworks as defined in RCW 70.77.136, within the County. This section does not apply to exemptions from licensing in RCW 70.77.311 for consumer fireworks used by religious and private organizations, or for fish and wildlife and agricultural purposes by a government agency. The more restrictive provisions of this section shall prevail over RCW 70.77.395.

ORDINANCE NO. _____

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING THURSTON COUNTY CODE CHAPTER 6.68 TO PROHIBIT THE SALE, PURCHASE, POSSESSION, OR USE OF FIREWORKS DURING BURN BANS AND OTHER EXTENUATING EMERGENCY CONDITIONS, AND FOR OTHER MATTERS PROPERLY RELATED THERETO.

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 77.77.250(4) and .395, the Board of Thurston County Commissioners (Board) have the authority to enact an ordinance to prohibit the sale, purchase, possession, or use of consumer fireworks; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to RCW 70.77.250, Any ordinances adopted by a county that is more restrictive than the state fireworks law shall have an effective date no sooner than one year after their adoption; and

WHEREAS, RCW 70.77.395 limits the sale and purchase of consumer fireworks from twelve p.m. to eleven p.m. on the twenty-eighth of June, from nine a.m. to eleven p.m. on each day from the twenty-ninth of June through the fourth of July, from nine a.m. to nine p.m. on the fifth of July; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ordinance No. 11946 the Board previously restricted the discharge of consumer fireworks to nine o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. on July 3rd and nine o'clock a.m. to eleven o'clock p.m. on July 4th; and

WHEREAS, heat, dry weather, and drought-like conditions can rapidly increase fire danger; and

WHEREAS, when conditions are extremely dry, Thurston County may find it necessary to issue a burn ban; and

WHEREAS, in 2015, while burn bans were in effect, numerous fires were started by fireworks in Washington State; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds that a temporary ban on fireworks further mitigates damage and risk to life and property and reduces the risk of fires due to fireworks in times of high fire danger and when other extenuating emergency conditions exist; and

WHEREAS, the Board finds it necessary for the protection of the health, safety and general welfare of the residents in Thurston County to authorize temporary bans regarding the use of consumer fireworks in times of high fire danger in unincorporated Thurston County.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS OF THURSTON COUNTY, AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION 1. The Thurston County Code, Chapter 6.68 is hereby amended to add a new section that prohibits the sale, possession and use of consumer fireworks during burn, bans and other extenuating emergency conditions, as shown in Attachment A to this ordinance.

OPTION 2: BAN WHEN BURN BAN OR EMERGENCY CONDITIONS

SECTION 2. SEVERABILITY. If any section, subsection, sentence, clause, phrase or other portion of this Ordinance or its application to any person is, for any reason, declared invalid, illegal or unconstitutional in whole or in part by any court or agency of competent jurisdiction, said decision shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions hereof.

SECTION 3. EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall take effect one year after adoption pursuant to RCW 70.77.250(4).

6.68.055 - Consumer fireworks.

No person shall discharge any consumer fireworks except within the times and dates set forth above. Further, pursuant to RCW 70.77.395, as amended by Second Substitute Senate Bill 6080 in 2002, Thurston County prohibits the sale, purchase, possession, or use of consumer fireworks on December 27, 2002 through 1:00 a.m. on January 1, 2003 and thereafter on the same period each year. The more restrictive provisions of this section shall prevail over RCW 70.77.395.

6.68.057 – Emergency Ban on Discharge of Consumer Fireworks.

The county manager, after consulting with the fire marshal, or other officials as may be deemed appropriate, may prohibit the discharge of all fireworks during periods of extreme fire danger.

OPTION 2: BAN WHEN BURN BAN OR EMERGENCY CONDITIONS

How to Read the Chart

If the **Ban or Restricted** column has the word:

- **None** — The jurisdiction follows the state law (see above).
- **Restricted** — The jurisdiction has restricted either the **Sales Period** and/or **Discharge Period**. If only one column has dates and times, it only applies to that period. The other period follows the state law. If there are dates and times in both, then both are restricted.
- **Banned** — The jurisdiction has banned both the Sales and Discharge of fireworks.

FIREWORKS AND EXPLOSIVE DEVICES THAT ARE ILLEGAL IN WASHINGTON STATE

Federally Legal Consumer Fireworks: These items are legal to purchase, possess, and discharge only at an Indian Reservation. Possession and/or use of the reservation is illegal.

Firecrackers

Generally 1/4" x 1 1/2" or less that come in packs to large bricks. A firecracker makes a single "pop" sound. Many firecrackers strung together will make repetitive "popping" sounds.




Sky Rockets and Missiles

Similar to the Bottle Rocket, a Sky Rocket is attached to a stick or has fins and may have a plastic cap. A missile will have fins rather than a stick. Once lit, it ascends rapidly, high into the air where it explodes.



Bottle Rockets


A firecracker type (tube) attached to a 12" long wooden stick. The stick is placed in a bottle and once lit, it rises into the air, travelling laterally before exploding.



Illegal Explosive Devices: The possession, manufacturing, or using of illegal Explosive Devices is a criminal offense.

M-80's, M-100's, etc.

Illegal since the 70's, an M-80 can contain flash powder, black powder, or a composition of materials that are sensitive to shock and can injure or kill people. Can do serious permanent damage to fingers, hands, and eyes.



Improvised Explosive Device (IED)

A pipe bomb is an improvised explosive device, consisting of a tightly sealed section of pipe that is filled with an explosive material. The pipe provides containment, meaning that a low explosive can be used to produce a relatively large explosion.




A tennis ball bomb is an improvised explosive device consisting of a ball filled with combustibles or pyrotechnic material with a fuse producing a loud explosion.



Altered Firework

Sparklers are bound together in electrical or duct tape to contain the ignition of the sparklers, providing for a loud "whoomp" sound with a flash of light.

Cylindrical Fountain

Upon ignition, a shower of colored sparks, and sometimes a whistling effect, is produced.



Helicopters, Aerial Spinners

A propeller or blade is attached, which, upon ignition, lifts the rapidly spinning device into the air. A visible or audible effect is produced at the height of flight.




Cone Fountain

Upon ignition, a shower of colored sparks, and sometimes a whistling effect, is produced.



Smoke Devices

Tube or sphere containing pyrotechnic composition that, upon ignition, produces a white or colored smoke as a primary effect.



Roman Candles

Heavy paper or cardboard tube containing pyrotechnic composition. Upon ignition, up to ten "stars" are individually expelled at several-second intervals.



Parachutes

Upon ignition, one or more parachutes are propelled into the air with stars, smoke, and other effects being discharged as the parachute floats downward.



Wheels

Pyrotechnic device attached to a post or tree by means of a nail or string. A wheel may contain up to six "driver" units; upon ignition, the wheel revolves, producing a shower of color and sparks and, sometimes, a whistling effect.



Mine/Shells/Cakes

Mine – An aerial device that shoots stars into the sky in an upward spray pattern.
Shell – A shell is an aerial item that is fired into the sky.
Cake – Dense-packed collection of mine/shell tubes that are fused together.



Ground Spinners

A small device similar to a wheel in design and effect. When placed on the ground and ignited, a shower of sparks and color is produced by the rapidly spinning device.



Reloadable Mortars

A shell consisting of a container, a lift charge, a time fuse, a burst charge, and stars/effects. The lift charge propels the shell out of the tube igniting the burst charge at the right altitude, igniting the effects.



Dipped Stick, Sparkler

Stick or wire coated with pyrotechnic composition that produces a shower of sparks upon ignition. Total pyrotechnic composition not to exceed 100 grams per item.



Novelties

"Trick and Novelty Devices" means any small firework device not classified as a Consumer of Display Firework. Items contain a small amount of pyrotechnic composition that is friction sensitive.
