Marijuana, weapons seized during bust

The Thurston County Narcotics Task Force seized more than 5 pounds of marijuana along with 11 firearms during a bust Monday night and early Tuesday at a Lacey residence and another address on Legion Way in Olympia.

Two women and one man were arrested, said Lacey Police Lt. Loreli Thompson, who leads the task force. According to court records, Christopher Lynn McClellan and Lindsay Miller were arrested in a vehicle after leaving the Lacey address. Caitlin Miles was arrested at the Legion Way address in Olympia.



Most of the marijuana and all of the firearms were seized at the Lacey address at 22nd Avenue and College Street, Thompson said Tuesday. A smaller amount of marijuana was seized at the Olympia address, she said.

The task force has obtained an arrest warrant for a fourth person, Thompson added.
