

Mail-In Voting Information

The 2003 Primary Election is a Vote-By-Mail election. All voters eligible to vote in the Primary Election will receive a ballot in the mail. This type of election allows you the convenience of voting at home and simply returning your ballot by mail. If you would rather return your ballot in person, you may drop it off at any of the locations listed below. Voters are strongly encouraged to return their ballots early.

Ballots **MUST** be voted and postmarked or dropped off no later than
Election Day, September 16, 2003
