**RAINIER SCHOOL DISTRICT NO. 307
PROPOSITION NO. 1
GENERAL OBLIGATION BONDS**

The Board of Directors of Rainier School District No. 307 passed Resolution No. 192 concerning a proposition to issue general obligation bonds. This proposition authorizes the District to expand and modernize Rainier Middle School and Rainier Elementary School; construct and equip new facilities at Rainier High School, and make other capital improvements, to pay for such projects by issuing \$8,045,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within a maximum of 21 years, and to levy property taxes annually, in addition to regular taxes, to repay such bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 192.

The bond requires 654 votes to validate and a 60% majority to pass. If less than 654 total votes are cast, this issue would need 393 total yes votes to pass.
