Election Result Information

- On Election Day, the Logic and Accuracy test will begin at 9:00 a.m. followed by the first count of ballots, with a second count at 5:00 p.m. Printouts of election results will be available Election Night shortly after 8:00 p.m. with the first release of results.
- Additional counts will be conducted daily beginning at 4:00 p.m. (weekends and holidays excluded) as required by law.
- The final certification count will begin September 2, at 11:00 a.m.
- Updated results will be available each day after all processed ballots have been counted. Daily tabulation may be postponed if the Auditor's Office is not in possession of at least 500 valid, processed ballots at the scheduled time.
- All measures require a simple majority to pass (50% + 1).

Fire Protection District No. 6 (East Olympia)
Proposition No. 1
Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 6 adopted Resolution No. 09-03 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize the District to restore its regular property tax levy for operations and maintenance in two phases: \$1.14 per \$1,000 of assessed value for collection in 2010 (\$0.28 increase over 2009); set the limit factor at 132% for 2011 (\$0.36 increase over 2010) and 106% for each of the four succeeding years (not exceeding \$1.50). The 2015 levy amount shall be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.
