On Election Day, the Logic and Accuracy test will begin at 7:00 a.m. followed by the tabulation of all processed ballots. Ballots received and inspected on Election Day will be tabulated later that afternoon. Printouts of the accumulated election results will be available Election Night shortly after 8:00 p.m.

Additional counts will be conducted daily (weekends and holidays excluded) as required by law. Daily tabulation may be postponed if the Auditor's Office is not in possession of at least 500 processed ballots, so please call to confirm when our next count will be. Updated results will be available each day after ballots have been counted.

City of Yelm
Proposition No. 1
Community Center and Park Bonds

The City Council of the City of Yelm has passed Ordinance No. 970 concerning financing the expansion of and improvements to Yelm City Park. If approved, this proposition would authorize issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not more than \$5,742,000 (maturing within 25 years or less) to pay costs of constructing a community center and supporting facilities and carrying out other park improvements, and authorize the annual levy of excess property taxes to pay and retire such bonds, all as provided in Ordinance No. 970.

Fire Protection District No. 15 (Munn Lake)
Proposition No. 1
Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 15 adopted Resolution No. 2013.001 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize an increase in regular property tax levies in 2014-2019 for fire protection services, equipment and facilities. The 2014 levy rate would be \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The limit factor for calculating the 2015-2019 maximum levies would be the increase in inflation, measured by the consumer price index, as identified in the resolution. The 2019 levy limit would be used to calculate future levy limits.

Fire Protection District No. 17 (Bald Hills)
Proposition No. 1
Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 17 adopted Resolution No. 13-03-01 concerning a proposition relating to the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would keep the District's regular property tax levy for maintenance and operations in an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2014 and would authorize setting the limit factor at 106% (but not to exceed a rate of \$1.50) for each of the five succeeding years; the 2019 levy limit will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.
