Election Result Information

Printouts of the first election results will be available Election Night shortly after 8:00 pm.

Updated results will be available each day after all processed ballots have been counted. Daily tabulation may be postponed if the Auditor’s Office is not in possession of at least 500 valid ballots at the scheduled time.

County Certification will be August 19, 2014 at 4:00 p.m.

Excess levies require a 60% approval to pass. School Districts **only** require a simple majority (50% + 1) to pass.

Bonds require 60% majority to pass and they must have a minimum number of votes cast equal to 40% of the total votes cast in the 2013 General Election.

Fire Protection District No. 3 (Lacey)

Proposition 1.

Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Fire Protection District No. 3, Thurston County, Washington, (Lacey Fire District 3) adopted Resolution No. 838-05-14 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. If approved, this proposition would restore the 2015 regular property tax levy to \$1.50/\$1,000 of assessed value and set the limit factor for calculating levy rates in 2016 through 2020 at 106%. New revenues would be used for fire protection, prevention, and emergency medical services, including maintenance, operation and replacement costs. The maximum permitted levy amount for 2020 would become the base for computing levy limits after this measure's expiration.
