Tenino School District No. 402
 Proposition No. 1
 Capital Levy for
 Safety, Technology and School Improvements

The Board of Directors of Tenino School District No. 402 adopted Resolution No. 3:2014-2015, concerning a proposition to finance safety, technology and school improvements. This proposition would authorize the District to upgrade the elementary schools, middle school and high school (including making safety improvements, expanding student access to classroom technology and improving learning environments), and levy the following excess taxes, on all taxable property within the District:

General Obligation Bonds to

Make Safety Improvements, and Construct and Renovate Schools

The Board of Directors of Yelm Community Schools adopted Resolution No. 01-14-15, concerning a proposition to finance safety, construction and renovation of schools. This proposition would authorize the District to: make safety improvements at all school facilities, construct a new Southworth Elementary School, construct a new Yelm Middle School, renovate Prairie Elementary School, construct a new 9th Grade Campus at Yelm High School, relocate Technology Center, and complete operations support facility; issue no more than \$53,900,000 of general obligation bonds maturing within 21 years; and levy annual excess property taxes to repay the bonds, all as provided in Resolution No. 01-14-15.
