On Election Day, the Logic and Accuracy test will begin at 7:00 a.m. followed by the tabulation of all ballots currently on hand. Ballots received and inspected on Election Day will be tabulated later in the afternoon of Election Day. Printouts of the accumulated election results will be available Election Night shortly after 8:00 p.m.

Additional counts will be conducted daily beginning at 5:00 p.m. (weekends and holidays excluded) as required by law.

Updated results will be available each day after all processed ballots have been counted. Daily tabulation may be postponed if the Auditor's Office is not in possession of at least 500 valid ballots at the scheduled time.

County Certification will be Tuesday, November 27, 2012 at 4:30 p.m.  
 State Certification occurs on December 6, 2012.

**City of Olympia  
Proposition No. 1  
Sales and Use Tax Increase of 0.1% for  
Public Safety and Criminal Justice Purposes**

The City Council of the City of Olympia adopted Resolution No. M-1780 concerning a sales and use tax increase pursuant to RCW 82.14.450. If approved, this proposition would authorize the City to impose an additional sales and use tax of 0.1%, split between the City (85%) and Thurston County (15%) as required by state law. City proceeds shall be used for public safety and criminal justice purposes as allowed by RCW 82.14.450.
