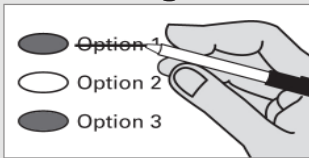
i Instructions

Marking Your Ballot



Completely fill in the oval to the left of your choice.
Use a dark blue or black ink pen. Do not use a pencil or gel pen.
Vote for one. If you vote for more than one, no votes for that candidate race or measure will be counted.

Correcting A Mistake



Do not erase any selection made in error. If you make a mistake, draw a line through the entire candidate's name or response.
If you wish to vote for another candidate or response, fill in the oval to the left of your corrected candidate or response.

Optional Write-In

To add a candidate, fill in the oval provided to the left of "write-in" and print the name on the line.

Additional Information

Read all instructions in your ballot packet.
Remember to sign and date the voter's declaration on the return envelope.
For a replacement ballot, please contact the Thurston County Auditor's Office at (360) 786-5408.
Deposit your ballot in a ballot drop box no later than 8:00 p.m. Election Day or mail using first class postage. It must be postmarked on or before Election Day.

This sample ballot contains all candidates and measures certified to appear on the August 6, 2013, Primary Election ballot. Be sure to follow all instructions on your actual ballot. Ballots will begin arriving on July 18, 2013. Please refer to the Thurston County Auditor's Office website at www.ThurstonVotes.org for additional election information.

City of Yelm

Proposition No. 1

Community Center and Park Bonds

The City Council of the City of Yelm has passed Ordinance No. 970 concerning financing the expansion of and improvements to Yelm City Park. If approved, this proposition would authorize issuance of general obligation bonds in an amount not more than \$5,742,000 (maturing within 25 years or less) to pay costs of constructing a community center and supporting facilities and carrying out other park improvements, and authorize the annual levy of excess property taxes to pay and retire such bonds, all as provided in Ordinance No. 970.

Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 15 adopted Resolution No. 2013.001 concerning a proposition to restore the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would authorize an increase in regular property tax levies in 2014-2019 for fire protection services, equipment and facilities. The 2014 levy rate would be \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed value. The limit factor for calculating the 2015-2019 maximum levies would be the increase in inflation, measured by the consumer price index, as identified in the resolution. The 2019 levy limit would be used to calculate future levy limits.

Fire Protection District No. 17 (Bald Hills)

Proposition No. 1

Levy Lid Lift

The Board of Fire Commissioners of Thurston County Fire Protection District No. 17 adopted Resolution No. 13-03-01 concerning a proposition relating to the District's regular property tax levy. The proposition would keep the District's regular property tax levy for maintenance and operations in an amount not to exceed \$1.50 per \$1,000 of assessed valuation for collection in 2014 and would authorize setting the limit factor at 106% (but not to exceed a rate of \$1.50) for each of the five succeeding years; the 2019 levy limit will be used to calculate subsequent levy limits.
