

Marker Name	McLane School
Marker Location	200 Delphi Road SW, Olympia. On the brick wall to the right of the main entrance way into the school.
Inscription	<p><i>McLane School. Built 1987. McLane was the fourth school district in Thurston County. It joined Olympia in 1966. It is named for pioneer William McLane (1819-1906) who came to Olympia by wagon train in 1852 from Pennsylvania. He homesteaded 320 acres in the valley below this school. He was a member of the territorial legislature in the 1860's and was a Thurston County Commissioner in 1871-1872. He donated 10 acres for the McLane Cemetery which is located across the freeway behind this school, and is buried there. He also donated land for the first McLane School which is now the Grange Hall property.</i></p> <p><i>Plaque donated in memory of Elsie McLane Shannon (1893-1988, class of 1908) by her children Neil (class of 1936) and Nelda (class of 1928).</i></p>
