

Marker Name: She-Nah-Nam - Medicine Creek Treaty

Marker Location: In the Nisqually Valley, on Old Pacific Highway at the intersection with 7th Ave, in front of the Texaco station.

Inscription:

She-Nah-Num

Medicine Creek Treaty.

1 1/4 miles northwest is a bronze tablet placed by the Sacajawea Chapter DAR marking site where Governor Stevens held council with Nisqually, Puyallup, and Squaxon Indians December 24-26, 1854.

This stone erected by Washington State Historical Society, 1922.

Date Installed: The original installation was 1922; it was moved to a less hazardous location in June 1994.

Installed By: The original installation was by the Washington State Historical Society; the reinstallation was by the Thurston County Historical Commission.

Condition: Good.

Visibility: Good.

Comments: The bronze tablet referenced on this marker is no longer in place. It was discovered to be missing in the early 1970's; it's whereabouts is unknown.
